Digital Equity Technical Assistance Grant Update

- Working through MWBE (Minority and Women-owned Business Enterprise) requirements
 - Need to apply for waivers for some proprietary services
 - Digital literacy survey (~\$60,000) must be bid out as it doesn't qualify for waiver
 - Don will work with Simone Ragland on waiver applications
 - Some suggested vendors to consider that might meet MWBE requirements:
 - Megan Farry Suggested Center for Regional Strategies
- Seeking volunteers for various workstreams including:
 - Community-level indicators identification
 - Dashboard population
 - Common metrics development for digital literacy
 - Survey design assistance
 - Focus group participation
 - Engagement strategies for covered populations

Featured Presentation: Niagara University's NTIA Digital Equity Grant

Guest Speaker: Karen Kwandrans, VP for Government and Community Relations

Grant Overview

- \$9.2 million grant secured in partnership with City of Niagara Falls
- Three main components:
 - Digital equity (community participation capacity)
 - Digital inclusion (Internet-enabled devices)
 - Digital literacy (education and training)

Key Implementation Points

- Will provide 24-hour device access through public library system
- Five WiFi kiosks/hubs throughout Niagara Falls

- Educational programming ranging from basic digital literacy to AI certification
- Targeting various populations including seniors, students, immigrants, and refugees
- Partnerships with multiple organizations including:
 - Niagara Falls School District
 - Memorial Medical Center
 - Jewish Family Services
 - Independent Living Center
 - M&T Bank

Grant Development Insights

- Quick turnaround: First team meeting August 22, due September 23
- Challenges included:
 - Complex NTIA portal requirements
 - Grid-based application format
 - Binding letters of commitment requirements
 - 20% matching funds requirement (~\$1.85 million)
 - Infrastructure cost considerations

Lessons Learned

- Importance of existing partnerships and relationships
- Value of comprehensive community data and needs assessment
 - Levesque Institute's Niagara Falls <u>Mapping Tool</u>
- Need for strong internal support (grant writers, legal, IT, etc.)
- Benefits of having trusted community partners
- Importance of understanding technical requirements and deadlines

Project Impact

- Will serve most areas of Niagara Falls except three higher-income neighborhoods
- Focus on covered populations as defined by grant requirements
- Infrastructure limitations led to strategic decisions about WiFi access points
- Continuing discussions about broader broadband access solutions
